
Holy Gospel Matthew 25:14–30




The Words of Our Lord







Congregational Governance Committee: a group has been formed to update and revise the constitution and by-laws of Trinity Lutheran Church. Currently, like many other churches, we are unable to meet the requirements of our constitution and by-laws. The ideas that are currently being considered are having fewer boards, which would require fewer people making long-term commitments and attending meetings. This could look like a manager, rather than a board, covering a particular ministry area (e.g., education or evangelism) who would recruit volunteers for short-term commitments to individual activities. The revision process is lengthy, and we will continue to provide updates. Before any revisions are finalized, the final results will be taken to the Voters Board for approval and then forwarded to the district for approval. We welcomed several new voters at the Voters meeting on Monday night (9/18). Please consider becoming a voter and having your voice heard in this process.
